The International All Star Federation (IASF) and the United States All Star Federation (USASF) only host two competitions a year – The Cheerleading Worlds and The Dance Worlds. The event producers of premier national championships sponsor their best teams to compete at these competitions. Cheer and dance teams from all over the world may qualify to compete in the applicable Senior or International divisions/ categories.

In 2011, each paid and partially-paid bid to The Worlds will cost the sponsoring event producer approximately \$7,000 to \$25,000 for each team they send. Given this, and the fact that many event producers are giving multiple bids, it is easy to see that these event producers are allocating substantial resources to support the teams that participate in their respective Nationals. These event producers feel so strongly about the caliber of the teams in these divisions at their Nationals that they want them to represent their respective company at The Cheerleading Worlds.

It is MANDA-TORY for two representatives (gym owners and/or coaches) from each team participating in either The Cheerleading or Dance Worlds to attend. The event is hosted at no cost for the two representatives from each team. Transportation will be provided from the host hotels to Epcot's World Showplace and is scheduled to begin at approximately 6:00 p.m. Please make travel arrangements to Orlando accordingly to ensure your representatives are there on time.

Note: If you have additional coaches and/or gym owners that would like to attend, additional tickets for this function will be available on a first come/first served basis. See the Ticket Order Form in The USASF/IASF Cheerleading and Dance Worlds Information and Registration Packet.

Television Coverage

The 2011 Cheerleading Worlds will be nationally televised on the ESPN and ESPN2 networks. Because of the format of the show, not all finalist teams or winners of all divisions will be shown on the telecast.

AMP will have FOUR Cameras on every Worlds stage capturing over 300 action shots of your athletes during each performance. Every Worlds athlete and coach will receive a FREE Photo Disc of all pictures taken during their performance(s) following the conclusion of their division. Coaches or Gym owners will receive them when they pick up and sign for their score sheets.

The Cheerleading Worlds 2011 Divisions – NEW!!

NEW: The preliminary performance orders for all Cheerleading Worlds Divisions will be randomly selected and webcasted **LIVE** on April 14th. In divisions requiring a Semi-Final round, all Paid and Partial Paid bid teams moving directly into the Semi-Final round will be randomly selected on the live webcast. Check the usasf.net website for more details to come.

NEW: During all of The Cheerleading Worlds preliminary and semi-final rounds, each team's score will be announced following their performance during the earliest break in their division's performances.

NEW: Senior Divisions- Level 5:

For divisions that include 40 or more registered cheer teams; all At Large Bid competitors will compete first in a Preliminary Round. This round will be early Saturday morning, April 30, 2011 at ESPN Wide World of Sports® Complex. The top 50% will move onto the compete in the Semi-Final round later that day. The Semi-Final round will be comprised of the top 50% of the Preliminary teams, plus all of the Partial Paid teams, and Paid bids team that are registered in that division. 50% of the afternoon Semi-Final teams will move onto the Finals, which will be held on Sunday, May 1, 2011 at the ESPN Wide World of Sports® Complex. The Semi-Final performance order for all 40 plus divisions will be reversed seeded based off the semifinal results and inserted in the open spots between the Paid and Partial Paid bid teams moving directly into the Semi-Finals. The performance order for finals will be reversed seeded based off the semifinal results.

Senior Divisions – Level 5: All teams entering the senior divisions must compete in the "prelims" on Saturday, April 30, 2011 at ESPN Wide World of Sports® Complex. 50% of the teams from each of the Senior Divisions, with less than 40 team registered, will progress from "prelims" to the "finals" on Sunday, May 1, 2011 at ESPN Wide World of Sports® Complex. The performance order for all divisions will be reversed seeded based off the preliminary results.

Senior Divisions - Level 5:

- Small Senior All Girl: 12-18 years, no males, 5 to 20 members
- Large Senior All Girl: 12-18 years, no males, 21 to 36 members
- Small Senior Limited Coed: 12-18 years, 1 to 4 males, 5 to 20 members
- Senior Limited Coed: 12-18 years, 1 to 4 males, 21 to 36 members
- Senior Semi-Limited Coed: 12-18 years, 5 to 12 males, 5 to 36 members
- Senior Unlimited Coed: 12-18 years, 13 or more males, 5 to 36 members

Senior Division Awards – The USASF/IASF will award the top 10 teams in all 6 senior divisions at The Cheerleading Worlds.

International Divisions - Level 5 & 6

Over the past 6 years, the international participation at The Cheerleading and Dance Worlds has grown from 3 international teams representing 2 countries to over 100 teams representing over 40 countries. The combined efforts of all involved in the USASF/IASF over the last few years have brought much needed change and opportunity for industry growth in the United States and internationally. It is understandable that "The Cheerleading and Dance Worlds" would exist in name only without the participation of international member event producers and all star gyms/teams. An important component to ensure their continued involvement is a more level playing field for teams in the international divisions. Through the research and input of the IASF General Assembly, IASF Rules Committee, IASF Worlds Competition Committee and the USASF/IASF Board of Directors, representing over 40 countries, the following guidelines for The 2011 Cheerleading Worlds International divisions, will be followed:

REVISED... U.S. Worlds Trials: All teams from the United States (U.S.) receiving bids and entering in the Worlds International Divisions must first compete in the U.S. Worlds Trials early Saturday, April 29th ONLY if there are 11 or more U.S. teams entered in one of the four International divisions. The top 10 U.S. teams, from each division required to have a U.S. Worlds Trial, will progress to The Worlds International preliminary round, now called the IASF Nations Cup, later that same day and will be reverse seeded based off the U.S. Worlds Trials results.

NEW - IASF Nations Cup Championship - will now be the title of the preliminary round in all four of the International divisions held Saturday, April 30, 2011 at ESPN Wide World of Sports® Complex. All U.S. teams, not competing in a U.S. Worlds Trials and non U.S. teams entering into The Worlds International divisions and the top 10 ranked U.S. Worlds Trials teams must compete in the IASF Nations Cup Championship. Following the completion of the IASF Nations Cup Championship divisions, the USASF/IASF will award trophies to all teams by their ranking within their own country. The IASF Nations Cup will also be awarded to the top 5 countries (ranking of nations) in each of the divisions. Each country's score will be determined by the average of all teams' scores from each country entered in the division. The highest scoring team from each country, ranked in the top 5 nations in each division, will be awarded the country's trophy.

A maximum of three (3) of the highest scoring teams from "each country" in each International division will progress from the Nations Cup Championship to "finals" on Sunday, May 1st. The performance order for all divisions will be reverse seeded based off the IASF Nations Cup Championship results.

International division score sheets will be available on the usasf.net website by November 15, 2010.

International Division Awards – The USASF/IASF will award the top 10 teams in all four International divisions at The Cheerleading Worlds.

International Level 5 Divisions:

- International Open (All Girl) -14 years and older, no males, 5 to 24 members
- International Open Coed -14 years and older, 1 – 12 males, 5 to 24 members

International Level 6 Divisions:

- International Open (All Girl) -17 years and older, no males, 5 to 24 members
- International Open Coed -17 years and older, 1 – 12 males, 5 to 24 members

The Cheerleading Worlds "Paid" Bids

"Paid" bids are awarded to the best teams in one or more of the Worlds Divisions at The Cheerleading Worlds qualifying events. Each event producer that hosts a Worlds qualifying event has the discretion to select the divisions and determine the process by which the bids are awarded.

The "Paid Bid" includes:

NEW - All teams awarded a "Paid" bid will be awarded, by the sponsoring event producer, a maximum of \$650 times the number of athletes on the floor, where the bid was awarded, plus two coaches. For example, a team receiving a bid that had 31 athletes on the floor plus two coaches will be awarded \$21,450. This amount will be used towards the team's USASF/IASF Worlds Accomodation Packages and transportation to Orlando. Additional expenses incurred will be the responsibility of the team/gym.

Event producers will not be responsible for late fees if their representing team does not meet the registration deadline. Event producers will not be responsible for change fees if their representing team has to make changes to the original registration.

The Cheerleading Worlds "Partial Paid" Bids

"Partial Paid" bids are awarded to the best teams in one or more of the Worlds Divisions at The Cheerleading Worlds qualifying events. Each event producer that hosts a Worlds qualifying event has the discretion to select the divisions and determine the process by which the bids are awarded.

NEW - All teams awarded a "Partial Paid" bid will be awarded, by the sponsoring event producer, a maximum of \$325 times the number of athletes on the floor where the bid was awarded plus two coaches. For example, a team receiving a bid that had 31 athletes on the floor plus two coaches will be awarded \$10,725. This amount will be used towards the team's USASF/IASF Worlds Accomodation Packages. Additional expenses incurred will be the responsibility of the team/gym.

"Partial Paid" checks will be made out to the USASF and mailed directly to the gym. That check must be used towards the team's accommodation packages and enclosed with the team's registration. The gym is responsible for the balance of the team's competition packages and the balance must be enclosed with the registration as well.

The Cheerleading Worlds "At Large" Bids

"At Large" bids are generally awarded to runner-up teams or the next highest scoring teams to the "Paid" or "Partial Paid" bid-winning team(s). However, each event producer that hosts a Worlds qualifying event has the discretion to select the divisions and determine the process by which the bids are awarded. Recipients of "At Large" bids are eligible to compete at Worlds, however they must pay for their own Worlds Accommodation Packages and all other related expenses. Event producers should publish the procedures they will follow for awarding bids prior to the start of their qualifying competition. An event producer may not award more than one bid of any type to the same team.

Bid Limitations

The Cheerleading Worlds: A team may receive no more than one bid to The Cheerleading Worlds, "Paid," "Partial Paid," or "At Large," for any given division. Should a team already have been awarded a bid to The Worlds, decline acceptance of a "Paid"/"Partial Paid"/"At Large, or fail to accept the "Paid"/"Partial Paid" / "At Large" bid by the 72 hour deadline, that bid may be transferred to an alternate team at the sponsoring event producer's discretion. The sponsoring event producer may not transfer ("hand down") any "At Large" bids or declined "At Large" bids after 96 hours from the end of their qualifying event. If a team has already accepted an "At Large" bid and opts to compete for another bid, they will be eligible only for a "Paid" or Partial Paid" bid. They will not be eligible for another "At Large" bid unless they decline the first "At Large" bid they were awarded, BEFORE competing for another "At Large" bid.

Accepting or declining bids must be done in writing to the sponsoring event producer and the USASF.

Bid Receiving Requirements

A team that receives and accepts any type of Worlds bid, must compete at the Worlds in the same division they were in at the qualifying event where their bid was awarded. The number of participants that "performed" on the competition floor at the qualifying event where the team received their bid may not be exceeded by the number of participants competing in that same division at The Cheerleading Worlds.

Timing Requirements for Bid Acceptance

"Paid", "Partial Paid" and "At Large" bid winners must accept the bid, complete and return the Bid Winners Acceptance Form to the sponsoring event producer that awarded the bid. The form must be faxed within 72 hours after the last day of the event where the bid was received. This means each team will need to have made up their minds prior to the Worlds qualifying event about whether they are going to accept the bid should they receive one. And if so, who will be going and what the travel specifics will be. The purpose of this tight timing is to control last minute changes that increase costs and make the entire travel experience disorganized. Should a team already have been awarded a bid to The Worlds, decline acceptance of a "Paid"/"Partial Paid"/"At Large, or fail to accept the "Paid"/"Partial Paid" / "At Large" bid by the 72 hour deadline, that bid may be transferred to an alternate team at the sponsoring event producer's discretion. The sponsoring event producer may not transfer ("hand down") any "At Large" bids or declined "At Large" bids after 96 hours from the end of their qualifying event

Once a team accepts their bid, the team needs to register by the listed deadline in The USASF/IASF Cheerleading and Dance Worlds Information and Registration Packet. Any team holding their registration in hopes of receiving a "Paid" or "Partial Paid" bid at a later Worlds bid qualifier but are unsuccessful in achieving this, will still be a late registration and will be placed on hold and charged a late registration fee.

The Cheerleading Worlds Travel Package and Registration

All team registration packets and required documents must be received in the USASF/IASF office by the noted deadlines in The Cheerleading Worlds Information and Registration Packets. PLEASE READ the Registration Deadlines and Payment Policies page. These packets include all of the information, package pricing, forms, and deadlines necessary for The Worlds registration. Extra copies of The Cheerleading Worlds Information and Registration Packets for spectators may be downloaded and printed from the USASF.net website.

Copies of all participants' birth certificates or passports must be with the team's coach/representative at all times and readily available upon request from a Worlds official. Copies of your athlete's birth certificates on a USB/Zip drive are acceptable.

NEW TIMELINE REQUIREMENT: All "CHEER" participants (who will perform at The Cheerleading Worlds) must be a USASF Member Athlete in order to join the team in the warm-up room/area and compete at The Cheerleading Worlds. All athletes must register or

renew their USASF Athlete Membership (\$25 per Athlete) by April 1, 2011. All athletes not registered by April 1, 2011 deadline will be accessed a \$10.00 late fee.

IMPORTANT: Each participant's name and USASF Membership ID# will be required on The Cheerleading Worlds' team roster form due by team's required Worlds Registration deadline. For more information about USASF Athlete Membership, please contact your USASF Regional Director. USASF/IASF Regional Directors' contact information is located on the USASF.net website.

International Teams - All visa requests will be cut off on February 15, 2011 and team registration packets and required documents must be received in the USASF/IASF office by the noted deadlines in The Cheerleading Worlds Information and Registration Packets. PLEASE READ the Registration Deadlines and Payment Policies page.

Coaches/Gym Owners/Organizations:

Cannot send a team to compete in the "same division" at The Cheerleading Worlds and a 2011 "end of season, multi-brand event".

Must be a current gym member of the USASF/IASF and in good standing with the USASF/IASF.

Must be a USASF or IASF Credentialed Coach, up to Level 5 (5 stars) in at least one category (tumbling, stunts, tosses), to enter the warm-up room/area at The Cheerleading Worlds.

NEW DEADLINES: ALL Coaches must be credentialed before they arrive at The 2011 Cheerleading Worlds in Orlando. Coaches that do not get credentialed before they arrive at The 2011 Worlds, will need to contact Angela Jones at the USASF to schedule an appointment to be Credentialed after they arrive in Orlando. There will be an additional \$100 On Site Administration Fee added to the Credentialing Fee to be USASF Credentialed by appointment at The 2011 Worlds in Orlando. Coaches that do not get credentialed before they arrive at The 2011 Worlds and do not make an appointment to be Credentialed in Orlando, will have to pay an additional \$200 On Site "Walk Up" Administration Fee added to the Credentialing Fee to be USASF Credentialed. NO EXCEPTIONS! Note: Upon completion coaches/gym owners/choreographers will receive a picture ID card that will allow access into the warm-up room/area. Only those individuals with valid (unexpired) credentials will be permitted. NO EXCEPTIONS!

- Must be listed as a coach of the performing team on all paperwork received by the USASF/IASF.
- Must be a coach in good standing at the gym they are representing.
- Must understand that they are a representative of the USASF/IASF Event Producer that awarded them the bid ("Paid"/"Partial Paid"/"At Large") at the USASF/IASF Worlds Championship. They agree to act with complete respect, sportsmanship, and graciousness at all times while representing the USASF/IASF Event Producer they represent at the USASF/IASF Worlds Championships.

NEW: USASF Credentialed Coaches, Gym Owners and Choreographers will ONLY be permitted "with their team" in the practice area and/or backstage area.

Eligible Athletes, Substitutions and Alternates

NEW: All athletes participating on a team at The 2011 Worlds, must be a registered member of that team's gym during the 2010 - 2011 competition season. Any athlete that has competed with another team from another gym (Primary Gym) or has been registered with the USASF as an athlete member from another gym (Primary Gym), during the same 2010 - 2011 competition season, will have to complete a USASF Gym Release Waiver, located at www.USASF.net, signed by the owner of that other gym (Primary Gym) before that athlete is eligible to compete at the 2011 Cheerleading Worlds with another gym (Secondary Gym). On The Cheerleading Worlds Roster, each athlete's name will have to be identified as either an original participant of the team that was on the floor where the bid was received, a substitution or an alternate. All names on the team rosters will be verified by the event producers who awarded the Worlds bid.

The rule that applies to substitutions is as follows:

• A Maximum of 10 substitutions will be allowed per team for The Cheerleading Worlds Championship.

A substitute must be a regular paid participant from another team at the same gym and must have competed "on the floor" with that team from that gym at the same event where the bid was awarded. All substitutes must meet the same eligibility requirements as the original team that was awarded a bid (i.e. age, etc.).

NEW - WORLDS ALTERNATES: Of the 10 possible substitutes, one to three of those 10 may be alternates. Alternates are registered members of the same team's gym where the bid was received. Alternates do not have to be rostered or in attendance at the Worlds bid qualifying event where the bid was received. Any athlete that has competed with another team from another gym (Primary Gym) or has been registered with the USASF as an athlete member from another gym (Primary Gym), during the same 2010 - 2011 competition season, will have to have a USASF Gym Release Waiver, located at www.USASF.net, signed by the owner of that other gym (Primary Gym) before that athlete is eligible to compete at The 2011 Cheerleading Worlds with another gym (Secondary Gym). If a team is found to have made an improper substitution or alternate, this team will:

- Be disqualified.
- Be responsible for repaying the total cost of any funds received through a "Paid" or "Partial Paid" bid.
- Not be eligible for any type of bid to The Cheerleading or Dance Worlds for the following year.

The USASF/IASF sponsored bids, "paid" or "partial paid," are for team members and two coaches. All sponsored team members must be on the floor during the team's performance at The Cheerleading Worlds. Alternates and/or additional athletes/coaches brought to substitute for unplanned occurrences are not covered under "Paid" or "Partial Paid" bids and will not be funded by the sponsoring event producer and must be eligible for substitution under the aforementioned substitution rules. Should a substitute and or an alternate become necessary after submission of your team's registered roster and after travel plans have been approved and confirmed, any additional costs associated with those substitution(s) must be paid by the gym.

Crossovers

At The Cheerleading Worlds, crossovers of participants between teams from the same gym are **NOT** permitted. In other words, a participant can only compete on one team from a gym/program. Crossovers of participants from other gyms will not be permitted.

Crossovers of participants between cheer and dance teams from the same or other gyms are not permitted. In other words, a performer may represent only one gym in either cheer or dance.

If teams are found to have a crossover, those teams will:

- Be disqualified.
- Be responsible for repaying the total cost of any funds received through a "Paid" or "Partial Paid" bid.
- Not be eligible for any type of bid to The Cheerleading or Dance Worlds for the following year.

Submitting Videotape for Legality Review

In an effort to ensure a penalty-free competition, all teams for The Cheerleading Worlds are encouraged to submit a videotape or DVD of the routine they will perform at the Worlds competition. This videotape or DVD should clearly show all stunts and tumbling so that they may be reviewed for legality purposes. Routines will be reviewed by an independent, neutral safety judging panel consisting of members of the USASF Rules Committee and/or its delegates. To secure confidentiality, the results of this review will be communicated only to the participating gym and will not be shared with any other gym or with The Cheerleading Worlds judging panel. Only videotapes or DVDs are acceptable for review. Electronically submitted routines will not be accepted.

Videotapes must be a clean VHS tape with the routine at the beginning of the tape. The tape or DVD must be clearly labeled with the following information:

- Videotapes or DVDs are due by April 15, 2011 and must be mailed to the following address:

Routines received after April 15, 2011 will not be reviewed. You will be notified by April 22, 2011 as to the results of the video review.

Note: Although routines will be reviewed for potential penalties prior to the competition via video submission, this does not preclude a team from being assessed a penalty while at the Worlds competition. The USASF/IASF will have rules judges in the warmup area and on the performance floor at The Worlds competition to ensure that all rules regarding the competition are followed.

PARTICIPANT BIRTH CERTIFICATES

Teams will no longer be required to submit a picture and a copy of each participants birth certificate with their registration. However, a copy of each participants birth certificate or passport must be made readily available upon request of a Worlds Official. 

1. What is the advantage of purchasing The Worlds Travel package?

NOTE: All athletes competing at The Cheerleading and Dance Worlds must purchase a travel package or commuter package.

The two main reasons teams and spectators purchase the travel package are convenience and savings.

a) Convenience-Everything is handled for you. Disney's Magical Express will pick you up and take you back to the Orlando International airport. There is no hassle of renting vans or cars and finding drivers. Hotel registration is smoother and rooms are guaranteed. The USASF/IASF office works together with Walt Disney World® to block your rooms so your entire group stays together.

If you book your own trip, you have to:

Step 1: Call travel Agency or airlines (which could take hours).

- Step 2: Send in deposit for airline tickets.
- Step 3: Call several hotels to get room rates and availability.
- Step 4: Guarantee all rooms using person credit card for deposit.
- Step 5: Request reimbursement check from the gym.
- Step 6: Send your rooming list to the hotel.
- Step 7: Call car rental agencies to find out rates and regulations of drivers.
- Step 8: Fill out registration form for The Worlds and mail in with registration fees.

Booking with us takes 2 steps:

Step 1: Book a flight that works for your budget and schedule.

Step 2: Fill out registration forms for the USASF/IASF and mail in deposits.

b) Savings- Because of our partner ship with the Walt Disney World Resort, the USASF/IASF is able to negotiate discounted rates for hotel rooms and theme park tickets.

2. What hotel are we staying at?

Accommodations will be provided at Disney's All Star Resorts and Disney's Caribbean Beach Resort. Your team may choose which resort they would like to be housed. Disney's All Star Resort is a very nice yet economical hotel. Disney's Caribbean Beach Resort is a more upscale hotel on the Walt Disney World® property. Therefore the main difference in package prices is the hotel cost only. All other services will remain the same for both hotels. 3. We have parents who would like to come to the Championship. Can they sign up for The Worlds travel package?

Of course! A lot of coaches meet with the parents and include them on the travel package with their team. However, we encourage family members and friends to register with us directly. For the Family and Friends registration form, see The Friends and Family Booklet.

4. We have an uneven number of girls. Can we pay the quad rate for three girls in a room?

No. The travel package prices have been calculated according to how many people are in each room.

5. Can we have five people in a room?

No. The All Star Resorts and Caribbean Beach Resort do not allow more than four people to a room.

6. We are arriving in Orlando at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, will our hotel rooms be ready?

Most hotels do not guarantee check in until 4:00 p.m. However, if there are rooms ready in your block, the hotel will check you in early. Please be sure to communicate this to your entire group that is traveling with you.

7. Our team doesn't leave Orlando until 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday. What can we do all day?

Hotel check out is at 11:00 a.m. If you would like, you can take a Walt Disney World® shuttle bus to Downtown Disney-West Side to shop. TICKETS AND COMPETITION

1. When will we receive our Walt Disney World® tickets for the Championship?

You receive your tickets when you register at The Worlds Check In Desk at your hotel in Orlando.

2. Do we use our 4-day PARK HOPPER ticket for competition?

Yes. You will need a Walt Disney World® ticket to enter Disney's Hollywood Studios™, EPCOT® as well as the ESPN Wide World of Sports® Complex for competition. Admission to ESPN Wide World of Sports® is <u>NOT</u> considered a theme park admission, and therefore does not use a day on your Park Hopper.

3. What does "PARK HOPPER" mean?

A PARK HOPPER allows you to go from Theme Park to Theme Park. Example: you can use your PARK HOPPER ticket to enter Disney's Hollywood Studios[™] for Competition Saturday morning and then go to Epcot® that evening, and it is only considered one day of admission. However, these tickets are only valid for four days.

4. Will attending The Worlds Block Party take days off of my PARK HOPPER pass?

For The Worlds Block Party at Disney's Hollywood Studios™, a day will not be taken off of your PARK HOPPER pass. Please Note: YOU MUST HAVE A WRISTBAND TO ATTEND THE PARTY.

5. If we do not use all four days of our Walt Disney World® tickets, may we use them next year?

No. All of the discounted tickets sold at The Worlds an expiration date that is listed on the back of your ticket.

6. Do spectators have to purchase a Walt Disney World® PARK HOPPER ticket in order to watch competition at ESPN Wide World of Sports® Complex?

- 1. I understand that cheerleading is a competitive activity, which requires the proper training techniques for all athletes under my direction.

- 3. I understand it is my ethical duty to put the interest and safety of my athletes first, and not to put cheerleaders under my direction at risk unnecessarily.
- 4. I understand that only USASF/IASF CREDENTIALED COACHES are permitted in the practice area and backstage at The Cheerleading Worlds.
- 5. I understand that only USASF/IASF MEMBER ATHLETES may compete at the Worlds!

SPORTSMANSHIP

- 1. I will support The Cheerleading Worlds outcome and represent my program with integrity.
- 2. I understand my position as a role model for my team and will conduct myself in a professional manner.

HOTEL

- 1. Absolutely NO tape or paint of any kind on any walls, windows or doors.
- 2. Be sure your team knows to leave the rooms as they find them (furniture) when they check out.
- 3. Don't prop your doors open.
- 4. Smoking and the use of alcohol by a minor is prohibited.
- 5. Illegal substances are prohibited.
- 6. Travel in groups of two or more.
- 7. Security they will be walking around at night and will be on patrol at all times. All participants will have a midnight curfew, and will be asked to show courtesy in keeping noise levels down.
- 8. Quiet time will be from 10:00pm till 10:00am. There is to be no practicing during these times, no parties outside, no loud music, etc.
- 9. Please don't damage the hotel or competition venues. You will be charged for any damage and could be removed from the hotel by Disney personnel.
- 10. Buses to the events will load and unload outside your registration location. YOU MUST HAVE YOUR NAMETAG TO GET ON THE BUS. Whether in uniform or not, you must have proof of being on our travel package to use the buses. CHEER GENERAL GUIDELINES Ι.

- The Cheerleading Worlds competition will follow the most recent version of Α. the USASF General Rules and Age Level Rules Chart. Refer to the USASF.net website for details. Note: On the USASF Age Grid, the Open Coed - Level 6 allows for 1 or more males. At Worlds, the International Open Coed - Level 6 only allows 1-12 males.
- B. Routine performance time may not exceed two minutes and thirty seconds. Timing will begin with the first movement, voice, or note of music, whichever comes first.
- C. If a team exceeds the time limit, a five point per judge penalty for every 5 seconds over the time limit will be assessed for each violation (i.e. 0-5 seconds = 5 points, 6-10 seconds = 10 points, etc.). BECAUSE PENALTIES ARE SEVERE, IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT ALL TEAMS TIME THEIR PERFORM-ANCE SEVERAL TIMES PRIOR TO ATTENDING THE COMPETITION AND LEAVE A SEVERAL SECOND CUSHION TO ALLOW FOR VARIATIONS IN SOUND EQUIPMENT.
- D. All teams who advance to The Cheerleading Worlds may use as many songs in the musical portion of their routine as they like. Each song MUST BE LICENSED ONLY BY ASCAP, BMI or SESAC. This is due to the television network requirements. All music (including entire songs or any portion of a song) must be licensed by either ASCAP, BMI or SESAC to be used in your routine for The Cheerleading Worlds. Any violation of this rule may subject the team to disqualification from the tournament and any associated television programs.
- F Teams may not use Disney themes nor may they have costumes that resemble a Disney character. However, Disney music that is ASCAP, BMI or SESAC licensed is acceptable.
- F Participants must start in the competition area and teams may line up anywhere inside the competition area. The competition area will be determined by the tournament director according to the size of the facility being used. Approximate floor size will be 54 feet wide x 42 feet deep (9 strips).
- G. All introductions (tumbling, entrances, chants, spell-outs, etc.) are considered part of the routine and are timed as part of the performance. There should not be any organized exits or other activities after the official ending of the routine.
- H. If a sign or prop is thrown outside the performing area, that team will receive a one point per judge deduction for each violation. Signs or props may be placed or dropped outside the performing area by a team member who must remain inside the performing area.
- Any team in violation of the Specific Safety Regulations will be assessed a deduction for each violation. A five point per judge penalty will be assessed for each violation.

II. FOR TEAMS COMPETITING IN THE DANCE WORLDS

Refer to The Dance Worlds Information and Registration Packet or the usasf.net website!

III. INTERRUPTION OF PERFORMANCE

A. UNFORESEEN CIRCUMSTANCES

- 1. If, in the opinion of the competition officials, a team's routine is interrupted because of failure of the competition equipment, facilities, or other factors attributable to the competition rather than the team, the team affected should stop the routine.
- 2. The team will perform the routine again in its entirety, but will be evaluated ONLY from the point where the interruption occurred. The degree and effect of the interruption will be determined by the competition officials.

B. FAULT OF TEAM

1. In the event a team's routine is interrupted because of failure of the team's own equipment and/or music, the team must either continue the routine or withdraw from the competition.

2. The competition officials will determine if the team will be allowed to perform at a later time. If decided by officials, the team will perform the routine again in its entirety, but will be evaluated ONLY from the point where the interruption occurred.

C. INJURY

- 1. In the event that an injury causes the team's routine to be interrupted, the participant can stop the routine and seek medical assistance.
- 2. Competition officials reserve the right to stop the routine if an injury occurs.
- 3. The competition officials will determine if the team will be allowed to perform at a later time. If the competition officials allow a routine to be performed at a later time, the spot in the schedule where the reperformance is to take place is at the sole discretion of competition officials. The team may perform the routine again in its entirety, but will be evaluated ONLY from the point where the interruption occurred.
- 4. The injured participant that wishes to perform may not return to the competition floor unless:
 - a. The competition officials receive clearance from, first, the medical personnel attending to that participant, the parent (if present) AND THEN the head coach/advisor of the competing team.
 - b. If the medical personnel do not clear the participant, the participant can only return to the competition if a parent or legal guardian in attendance signs a return to participation waiver. In the event of a suspected concussion, the participant cannot return to perform without clearance from a medical professional, even with a waiver from a parent or legal guardian.

IV. HOW TO HANDLE PROCEDURAL OUESTIONS

Any question concerning the rules or procedures of the tournament will be handled exclusively by one designated representative of the team (i.e. director, coach or captain) and will be directed only to a Competition Official. Such questions should be made prior to the team's competition performance. Any questions concerning the team's performance should be made to a Competition Official immediately after the team's performance.

V. INTERPRETATIONS AND RULINGS

Any interpretation of any aspect of these Rules and Regulations or any decision involving any other aspect of the tournament will be rendered by the Worlds Competition Rules Committee. The Worlds Competition Rules Committee will render a judgment in an effort to ensure that the tournament proceeds in a manner consistent with the general spirit and goals of the tournament. The Rules Committee will consist of the Event Director, Head Judge, and either the USASF/IASF Rules Committee Chair or a tournament official designated by the Chair. The Event Director may appoint additional members to those listed above to be members of the Worlds Competition Rules Committee.

VI. FINALITY OF DECISIONS

By participating in this championship, each team agrees that the decisions by the judges will be final and will not be subject for review. Each team acknowledges the necessity for the judges to make prompt and fair decisions in this competition and each team therefore expressly waives any legal, equitable, administrative or procedural review of such decisions.

VII.SPORTSMANSHIP

All participants agree to conduct themselves in a manner displaying good sportsmanship throughout and following the tournament. The coach and/or gym owner of each team is responsible for seeing that team members, coaches, parents and any other persons affiliated with the team conduct themselves accordingly. Severe cases of unsportsmanlike conduct are grounds for penalties and/or disqualification.

VIII. DEDUCTIONS AND DISQUALIFICATIONS

Any team in violation of the "Rules and Regulations" will be assessed a deduction for each violation. Any team that does not adhere to the terms and procedures in the "Rules and Regulations" may be disqualified from the competition and automatically forfeit the right to any prizes or awards presented by the competition. In addition, the team may also forfeit the opportunity to participate in The Cheerleading or Dance Worlds the following year.

IX. SCORES AND RANKINGS

Individual judges' score sheets are for the exclusive use of each particular judge. Each judge has the responsibility and authority to review and submit his or her final scores and rankings prior to the final tally of the scores for all teams and/or the announcement of results. Scores and rankings will be available only to coaches or gym owners at the conclusion of the competition. Ties will not be broken, except to determine the Bronze, Silver and Gold places in finals.

X. TELEVISION COVERAGE

The Cheerleading Worlds may be nationally televised. Because of the format of the show, not all finalist teams will be shown on the telecast.

XI. APPEARANCES, ENDORSEMENTS AND PUBLICITY

All teams winning titles, awards or prizes agree to have all appearances, endorsements and publicity approved through the USASF office.

XII. 2010-2011 USASF SAFETY RULES

The Cheerleading Worlds competition will follow the most recent version of the USASF General Rules and Age Level Rules Chart. Refer to the USASF.net website for details.

GENERAL SAFETY RULES AND ROUTINE REQUIREMENTS

- 1. All athletes must be supervised during all official functions by a qualified director/coach.
- Coaches must require proficiency before skill progression. Coaches must consider the athlete, group, and team skill levels with regard to proper performance level placement.
- 3. All teams, gyms, coaches and directors must have an emergency response plan in the event of an injury.
- Athletes and coaches may not be under the influence of alcohol, narcotics, per-D. formance enhancing substances, or over-the-counter medications while partic-E. ipating in a practice or performance that would hinder the ability to supervise or execute a routine safely.
- 5. Athletes must always practice and perform on an appropriate surface.
- Soft-soled shoes must be worn while competing. No dance shoes/boots, F. and/or gymnastics slippers (or similar) allowed. Shoes must have a solid sole. G
- 7. Jewelry of any kind including but not limited to ear, nose, tongue, belly button and facial rings, clear plastic jewelry, bracelets, necklaces and pins on uniforms are not allowed. Jewelry must be removed and may not be taped over. Exception: medical ID tags/bracelets, and uniform rhinestones. Rhinestones are not allowed when adhered to the skin as opposed to a uniform. Temporary tattoos are also allowed.
- 8. Any height increasing apparatus used to propel an athlete is not allowed. Exception: spring floor.
- 9. Flags, banners, signs, pom pons, megaphones, and pieces of cloth are the only props allowed. Props with poles or similar support apparatus may not be used in conjunction with any kind of stunt or tumbling. All props must be safely discarded out of harms way (example: throwing a hard sign across the mat from a stunt would be illegal). Any uniform piece purposefully removed from the body and used for visual effect will be considered a prop.
- 10. Casts that are hard and unyielding or have rough edges must be appropriately covered with a padded material. Clarification: The appropriately padded material must be such that it protects both the athlete and fellow athletes from injury.
- On the level grid, all skills allowed for a particular level encompass all skills allowed in the preceding level.
- 12. Required spotters for all skills must be your own team's members ${\mbox{and}}\ {\mbox{be}}$

trained in proper spotting techniques.

- 13. Drops including but not limited to knee, seat, thigh, front, back, and split drops from a jump, stunt, or inverted position are not allowed unless the majority of the weight is first borne on the hands or feet, which breaks the impact of the drop. Shushinovas are allowed. *Clarification: Drops that include any weight bearing contact with the hands and feet would not be in clear violation of this rule.*
- 14. Competition routines shall not exceed 2 minutes and 30 seconds.
- 15. Athletes must have at least one foot, hand or body part (other than hair) on the performing surface when the routine begins.

Exception: Athletes may have their feet in the hands of base(s) if the base(s) hands are resting on the performing surface.

LEVEL 5 RULES

LEVEL 5 GENERAL TUMBLING

- A. All tumbling must originate from and land on the performing surface. Exception: Tumbler may [without hip-over-head rotation] rebound from his/her feet into a stunt transition. Rebounding to a prone position in a stunt is allowed.
- B. Tumbling over, under, or through a stunt, individual, or prop, is not allowed. *Clarification: An individual may jump over another individual.*
- C. Tumbling while holding or in contact with any prop is not allowed.
- D. Assisted or connected tumbling is not allowed. Clarification: Double cartwheels and double forward rolls are allowed because they will be interpreted as stunts, not assisted tumbling.
- E. Dive rolls are allowed:

Exception: Dive rolls performed in a swan/arched position are not allowed. Exception: Dive rolls that involve twisting are not allowed.

LEVEL 5 STANDING/RUNNING TUMBLING

A. Skills are allowed up to 1 flipping and 2 twisting rotations.

LEVEL 5 STUNTS

- A. A spotter is required for each top person in an extended stunt.
- B. Single leg extended stunts are allowed.
- C. Twisting mounts and twisting transitions are allowed up to **2 twisting rotations** by the top person in relation to the performing surface.

Clarification: A twist performed with an additional turn by the bases performed in the same skill set, would be illegal if the resulting cumulative rotation of the top person exceeds 2 rotations.

- Free flipping mounts and transitions are not allowed.
- E. Prep level or above pendulum and pendulum style transitional stunts where the top person falls away from the bases requires three stationary catchers, at least two of which are not original bases. During pendulum and pendulum style transitional stunts at least one base must remain in contact with the top person.
 F. Single based split catches are not allowed.
- G. Single based double awesomes/cupies require a separate spotter for each top person.
- H. L5 Stunts-Release Moves
 - Release moves are allowed but must not exceed more than eighteen inches above extended arm level (example: tic-tocks are allowed).
 - 2. Release moves may not land in a prone or inverted position.
 - 3. Release moves must return to original bases. Clarification: An individual may not land on the performing surface without assistance.
 - Helicopters are allowed up to a 180 degree rotation with a ¹/₂ twist and must be caught by at least 3 catchers, one of which is positioned at head and shoulder area of the top person.
 - 5. Release moves may not intentionally travel.
 - 6. Release moves may not pass over, under or through other stunts, pyramids or individuals.
 - L5 Stunts-Inversions
 - 1. Extended inverted stunts allowed. Also, see "Stunts" and "Pyramids."
 - 2. Downward inversions are allowed from prep level and above and must be assisted by at least three bases, at least two of which are positioned to protect the head and shoulder area. Contact must be initiated at the shoulder level (or above) of the bases. *Clarification: Catchers must make contact with the head and shoulder area.*

2010 RULES AND REGULATIO

Exception: A controlled power pressing of an extended inverted stunt LEVEL 5 DISMOUNTS (example: needle) to shoulder level is allowed.

- 3. Downward inversions must maintain contact with an original base. Exception: In side rotating downward inversions, the original base may B. lose contact with the top person when it becomes necessary to do so (example: cartwheel-style transition dismounts).
- 4. Downward inversions from above prep level may not be caught and/or C. land in an inverted position. Clarification: Top person may not be caught or land with their shoulders below their hips.
- J. Bases may not support any weight of a top person while that base is in a backbend or inverted position.

LEVEL 5 PYRAMIDS

- up to 2 high.
- B. Top persons must receive primary support from a base.
- C. L5 Pyramids-Release Moves
 - 1. During a pyramid transition, a top person may pass above 2 persons high **LEVEL 5 TOSSES** while in direct physical contact with at least one person at prep level or A. Tosses are allowed up to a total of 4 tossing bases. One base must be behind below.
 - 2. Primary weight may not be borne at second level. Clarification: The transition must be continuous.
 - 3. Non-inverted pyramid release moves must be caught by at least 2 catchers.
 - a. In pyramids where the top person travels over their bracer (example: leap frogs, wolf wall transitions), both catchers must be stationary.
 - b. Both catchers must maintain visual contact with the top person C. Flipping, inverted or traveling tosses are not allowed. throughout the entire transition.
 - 4. Non inverted transitional pyramids may involve changing bases. When changing bases:
 - a. The top person must maintain physical contact with a person at prep E. Up to 2-1/2 twisting rotations allowed. level or below.
 - b. The top person must be caught by at least 2 catchers. Both catchers must be stationary and may not be involved with any other skill or choreography when the transition is initiated.
- D. L5 Pyramids-Inversions

- 1. Must follow L5 stunt inversions rules.
- E. L5 Pyramids-Release moves w/ braced inversions
 - 1. Pyramid transitions may involve braced inversions (including braced flips) while released from the bases if contact is maintained with at least 1 person at prep level or below. Contact must be maintained throughout entire transition with either the top person(s) or the base(s). Clarification: Top person(s) bracing the inversion must show a concerted effort to maintain contact with the inverted top person until they are safely caught by the bases.
 - 2. Braced inversions (including braced flips) are allowed up to 1-1/4 flipping rotations.
 - Braced inversions (including braced flips) are allowed up to 1 twist if 3. contact is maintained with 2 top persons at prep level or below.
 - 4. Inverted transitional pyramids may involve changing bases.
 - Braced inversions (including braced flips) must be in continuous move-5. ment.
 - 6. All braced inversions (including braced flips) must be caught by at least 3 catchers.
 - a. The 3 catchers must be stationary.
 - The 3 catchers must maintain visual contact with the top person b. throughout the entire transition.
 - c. The 3 catchers may not be involved with any other skill or choreography when the transition is initiated.
 - 7. Braced inversions (including braced flips) may not travel downward while inverted.

- A. Cradles from single based stunts must have a separate spotter with at least one hand/arm supporting the head and shoulder area through the cradle.
- Cradles from multi-based stunts must have two catchers and a separate spotter with at least one hand/arm supporting the head and shoulder area through the cradle.
- Dismounts to the performing surface from stunts and pyramids must be assisted by an original base.

Clarification: An individual may not land on the performing surface without assistance.

- D. Up to a 2-1/4 twisting rotations allowed from all stunts.
- E. No free flipping dismounts allowed.
- Tension drops/rolls of any kind are not allowed. F.
- A. Pyramids must follow Level 5 "Stunts" and "Dismounts" rules and are allowed G. When cradling single based double awesomes/cupies, 2 catchers must catch each top person. Catchers and bases must be stationary prior to the initiation of dismount.

- the top person during the toss and may assist the top person into the toss.
- Β. Tosses must be performed from ground level and must land in a cradle position. Top person must be caught in a cradle position by at least 3 original bases one of which is positioned at the head and shoulder area of the top person. LEVEL 6 GENERAL TUMBLING

A. All tumbling must originate from and land on the performing surface. Exception 1: Tumbler may (without hip-over-head rotation) rebound from his/her feet into a stunt transition. Rebounding to a prone position in a stunt is allowed.

Exception 2: Round off rewinds and standing single back handspring rewinds are allowed. No tumbling skills prior to the round-off or standing BHS are permitted.

- Β. Tumbling over, under, or through a stunt, individual, or prop, is not allowed. Clarification: An individual may jump over another individual.
- Tumbling while holding or in contact with any prop is not allowed.
- D. Assisted or connected tumbling is not allowed. Clarification: Double cartwheels and double forward rolls are allowed because they will be interpreted as stunts, not assisted tumbling. F Dive rolls are allowed:

Exception: Dive rolls performed in a swan/arched position are not allowed. Exception: Dive rolls that involve twisting are not allowed.

LEVEL 6 STANDING/RUNNING TUMBLING

A. Skills are allowed up to 1 flipping and 2 twisting rotations.

LEVEL 6 STUNTS

- A. A spotter is required:
 - During extended, one-arm stunts other than an awesomes/cupies or lib-1 erties
 - 2. When the load/transition involves a twist or flip.
- Β. Twisting stunts and transitions are allowed up to 2 twisting rotations by the top person in relation to the performing surface.

Clarification: A twist performed with an additional turn by the bases performed in the same skill set, would be illegal if the resulting cumulative rotation of the top person exceeds 2 rotations.

C. Free flipping or assisted flipping stunts and transitions are allowed. Rewinds F. must originate from ground level only and are allowed up to 1 flipping and 2 twisting rotations.

Exception 1: Rewinds to a cradle position are allowed. All free flipping transitions caught at shoulder level or below must use an additional catcher who protects the head and neck. (example: a flip that lands in a straddle position) Exception 2: Round off rewinds and standing single back handspring rewinds are allowed. No tumbling skills prior to the round-off or standing BHS are permitted.

- D. Transitional stunts may involve changing bases.
- E. Single based split catches are not allowed.
- Single based double awesomes/cupies require a separate spotter for each top F. person
- G. L6 Stunts-Release Moves
 - 1. Release moves are allowed.
 - 2. Release moves may not land in a prone or inverted position.
 - Release moves must return to original bases.

Exception: Coed style tosses to a new base are allowed if the stunt is thrown by a single base and caught by at least one base and an additional spotter who are not involved in any other skill or choreography when the transitions is initiated.

Clarification: An individual may not land on the performing surface without assistance.

- 4. Helicopters are allowed up to a 180 degree rotation with a 1/2 twist and must be caught by at least 3 catchers, one of which is positioned at head and shoulder area of the top person.
- 5. Release moves may not intentionally travel. See exception in #3 above.
- Release moves may not pass over, under or through other stunts, H. Tension drops/rolls of any kind are not allowed. pyramids or individuals.
- H. L6 Stunts-Inversions

AND REGULAT

RULES

1. Downward inversions from above prep level must be assisted by at least 2 bases. Top person must maintain contact with a base.

LEVEL 6 PYRAMIDS

- A. Pyramids are allowed up to 2-1/2 high.
- B. For 2-1/2 high pyramids, there must be a spotter in front and back for each person on the top level, and the spotter(s) must be in position the entire time the top person(s) is at the 2-1/2 high level(s). Spotters may stand slightly to the side but must remain in a position to adequately spot the top person. Spotters must maintain visual contact with the top person the entire time the top person is at the 2-1/2 high level. Spotters may not be a primary support of the pyramid.
- C. Free-flying mounts must originate from ground level only and are allowed up to 1 flipping and 1 twisting rotation, or 0 flipping and 2 twisting rotations.
- D. L6 Pyramids–Release Moves
 - 1. During a pyramid transition, a top person may pass above 2-1/2 high while in direct physical contact with at least one person at prep level or below.
- E. L6 Pyramids-Inversions
 - 1. Inverted stunts are allowed up to 2-1/2 persons high and must be braced by at least 1 person at prep level or below.
 - 2. Downward inversions from above prep level must be assisted by at least 2 bases. Top person must maintain contact with a base or another top person.

Division

- L6 Pyramids-Release Moves w/ Braced Inversions
- 1. Braced flips are allowed up to up to $1-\frac{1}{4}$ flipping and 1 twisting rotation.
- 2. Braced flips are allowed if direct physical contact is maintained with at least 1 top person at prep level or below and must be caught by at least 2 catchers.

LEVEL 6 DISMOUNTS

- A. Single based cradles that exceed 1-1/4 twisting rotations must have a spotter assisting the cradle with at least one hand/arm supporting the head and shoulder of the top person.
- Β. Dismounts to the performing surface from stunts and pyramids must be assisted by an original base.

Clarification: An individual may not land on the performing surface without assistance.

- C. Up to a 2-1/4 twist cradle is allowed from all stunts and pyramids up to 2 persons high and requires at least 2 catchers. Cradles from 2-1/2 high pyramids are allowed up to 1-1/4 twist and require 3 catchers.
 - Exception: 2-1-1 thigh stands may perform 2 twists from a forward facing stunt only (example: extension, liberty, heel stretch).
- Free flipping dismounts are allowed up to 1-1/4 flipping and 0 twisting rotations. D.
- E. Free flipping dismounts to the performance surface are not allowed.
 - Flips into cradles from prep level or below stunts require at least 2 catchers, one of which is an original base.
- G. Flips that originate above prep level are not allowed.

Exception: 3/4 front flip may occur from a 2-1/2 high pyramid but requires 2 catchers and an additional spotter positioned at the head and shoulder area of the top person. Spotter may stand slightly to the side but must use at least one hand/arm to catch under the top person's head and shoulders.

- - I. When cradling single based double awesomes/cupies 2 catchers must catch each top person. Catchers and bases must be stationary prior to the initiation of the dismount.

LEVEL 6 TOSSES

- A. Tosses are allowed up to a total of 4 tossing bases. One base must be behind the top person during the toss and may assist the top person into the toss.
- Β. Tosses must be performed from around level and must land in a cradle position. Top person must be caught in a cradle position by at least 3 original bases one of which is positioned at the head and shoulder area of the top person. Bases must remain stationary during the toss (example: no intentional traveling tosses).
- C. Flipping tosses are allowed up to 1-1/4 flipping rotation and 2 twists.
- D. No stunt, pyramid, individual, or, prop may move over or under a toss, and a toss may not be thrown over, under, or through stunts, pyramids, individuals, or props.
- Ε. Non-flipping tosses may not exceed 3-1/2 twists.
 - Top persons tossed to another set of bases must be caught in a cradle position by at least 3 stationary catchers. Catchers may not be involved in any other choreography and must have visual contact with top person when the toss is initiated and must maintain visual contact throughout the entire toss. The toss is allowed up to 0 flipping and 1-1/2 twisting rotations. The bases involved in the toss must be stationary while tossing.

Exception: 3/4 front flips with no twists are allowed
