
INFORMATION PACKET



APRIL 24-27, 2009 AT THE WAY DISNEPWORLD Resort

The International All Star Federation (IASF) and the United States All Star Federation (USASF) only host two competitions a year — The Cheerleading Worlds and The Dance Worlds. The event producers of premier national championships sponsor their best teams to compete at these competitions. Cheer and dance teams from all over the world may qualify to compete in the applicable Senior or International divisions/categories.

In 2008, each paid and partially-paid bid to The Worlds cost the sponsoring event producer approximately \$3,000 to \$25,000 for each team they sent. Given this, and the fact that many event producers are giving multiple bids, it is easy to see that these event producers are allocating substantial resources to support the teams that participate in their respective Nationals. These event producers feel so strongly about the caliber of the teams in these divisions at their Nationals that they want them to represent their respective company at The Worlds.

VIP COACHES RECEPTION AND AWARDS CEREMONY

The IASF & USASF will host this very special and elegant function on Friday, April 24, 2009. It is MANDATORY for two representatives (gym owners and/or coaches) from each team participating in either The Cheerleading or Dance Worlds to attend. The event is "free" for the two representatives from each team. Transportation will be provided from the host hotel to Epcot's World Showplace and is scheduled to begin at approximately 5:00 p.m. Please make travel arrangements to Orlando accordingly to ensure your representatives are there on time.

THE CHEERLEADING WORLDS 2009 DIVISIONS – NEW!!

Senior Divisions - Level 5 - All teams entering the senior divisions must compete in the "prelims" on Saturday, April 25th at Disney's Wide World of Sports® Complex and/or Disney's Hollywood Studios™. Performance order for all senior divisions "prelims" will be scheduled as follows: At Large Bid winners will perform first, Partially Paid Bid winners will perform second, and Paid Bid winners last. There will be a minimum of 50% of the teams, from each of the following divisions, progressing from "prelims" to the "finals" on Sunday, April 26th at Disney's Wide World of Sports® Complex and/or Disney's Hollywood Studios™. The performance order for all divisions will be reversed seeded based off the preliminary results.

Senior Divisions - Level 5:

- Small Senior All Girl: 11-18 years, no males, 5 to 20 members
- Large Senior All Girl: 11-18 years, no males, 21 to 36 members

NEW... Small Senior Limited Coed: 11-18 years, 1 to 4 males, 5 to 20 members

- Large Senior Limited Coed: 11-18 years, 1 to 4 males, 21 to 36 members
- Senior Unlimited Coed: 11-18 years, 5 or more males, 5 to 36 members

<u>Senior Division Awards</u> – The USASF/IASF will award the top 10 teams in all 5 senior divisions at the Cheerleading Worlds.

INTERNATIONAL DIVISIONS -LEVEL 5 AND LEVEL 6

Over the past 3 years, the international participation at the Cheerleading and Dance Worlds has grown from 3 international teams representing 2 countries to over 75 teams representing 28 countries. The combined efforts of all involved in the USASF/IASF over the last few years have brought much needed change and opportunity for industry growth in the United States and internationally. It is understandable that "The Cheerleading and Dance Worlds" would exist in name only without the participation of interna-

tional member event producers and all star gyms/teams. An important component to ensure their continued involvement is a more level playing field for teams in the international divisions. Through the research and input of the IASF General Assembly, IASF Rules Committee, IASF Worlds Competition Committee and the USASF/IASF Board of Directors, representing over 22 countries, the following guidelines for the 2009 Cheerleading Worlds International divisions, will be followed:

- 1. All teams receiving bids and entering into the Worlds International Divisions must compete in the "prelims" on Saturday, April 25th.
- 2. A maximum of three (3) of the highest scoring teams from "each country" in each International division will progress from "prelims" to "finals" on Sunday, April 26th. The performance order for all divisions will be reversed seeded based off the preliminary results.
- 3. International division score sheets will be adjusted to reflect the predominant international skill capabilities. These score sheets will be available on the usasf.net website by Nov. 15, 2008.

International Awards — In addition to the USASF/IASF awarding the top 10 teams in all six International divisions at the Cheerleading Worlds, the IASF will award the top 10 countries (ranking of nations) in each of the following:

IASF Nations Cup Championship -All Girl Cheer

The IASF will take the average of all teams from each country (in the finals of all 3 International Cheer All Girl Divisions), to come up with an overall ranking of nations. We will present the award to the highest scoring team from each country ranked in the top 10.

IASF Nations Cup Championship -Coed Cheer

The IASF will take the average of all teams from each country (in the finals of all 3 International Cheer Coed Divisions), to come up with an overall ranking of nations. We will present the award to the highest scoring team from each country ranked in the top 10.

INTERNATIONAL LEVEL 5 DIVISIONS:

- International Junior (All Girl) -14 years and younger, no males, 5 to 36 members
- International Junior Coed -14 years and younger, 1 or more males, 5 to 36 members
- International Open (All Girl) -14 years and older, no males, 5 to 24 members
- International Open Coed -14 years and older,
 1 12 males, 5 to 24 members

INTERNATIONAL LEVEL 6 DIVISIONS:

- International Open (All Girl) -17 years and older, no males, 5 to 24 members
- International Open Coed -17 years and older,
 1 12 males, 5 to 24 members

THE CHEERLEADING WORLDS "PAID" BIDS

"Paid" bids are awarded to the best teams in one or more of the Worlds Divisions at The Cheerleading Worlds qualifying events. Each event producer that hosts a Worlds qualifying event has the discretion to select the divisions from and the process by which the bids are awarded. The "Paid Bid" includes:

*USASF/IASF Three Night Accommodation Package (Quad Occupancy) at AllStar - only for 2 coaches and the same number of members that were "on the floor" at the qualifying event where the bid was received. Checks for the "Paid" bid team's packages will be made out to the USASF/IASF and mailed directly to the gym. That check must be enclosed with the team's registration. *Transportation - only for 2 coaches and the same number of members that were on the floor at the qualifying event where the bid was received. Each event producer will try to accommodate the team's first choice in transportation. However, event producers will provide the safest and most economical mode of transportation.

All "Paid" bids will have a maximum cap at \$25,000 per team. This does not mean a "Paid" bid team is guaranteed "\$25,000 towards their trip to Worlds. Any additional expenses incurred will be the responsibility of the team/gym. Once travel plans have been approved and confirmed for a "Paid" bid, any changes that result in additional cost will be charged to the team, even if the maximum cap of \$25,000 has not been reached – this includes charges for substitutions. Event producers will not be responsible for late fees if their representing team does not meet the registration deadline.

THE CHEERLEADING WORLDS "PARTIAL PAID" BIDS

"Partial Paid" bids are awarded to the best teams in one or more of the Worlds Divisions at The Cheerleading Worlds qualifying events. event producer that hosts a Worlds qualifying event has the discretion to select the divisions from and the process by which the bids are awarded. Those event producers offering "Partial Paid" bids will award a "specified dollar amount" towards the team's accommodation package to the Worlds. "Partial Paid" bids awarded may not exceed \$7,500 per team. "Partial Paid" checks will be made out to the USASF and mailed directly to the gym. That check must be used towards the team's accommodation packages and enclosed with the team's registration. The gym is responsible for the balance of the team's competition packages and the balance must be enclosed with the registration as well.

THE CHEERLEADING WORLDS "AT LARGE" BIDS (UNPAID)

"At Large" bids are generally awarded to runnerup teams or the next highest scoring teams to the "Paid" or "Partial Paid" bid-winning team(s). However, each event producer that hosts a Worlds qualifying event has the discretion to select the divisions from and the process by which the bids are awarded. Recipients of "At Large" bids are eligible to compete at Worlds, however they must pay for their own Worlds Accommodation Packages and all other related expenses.

Event producers must publish the procedures they will follow for awarding bids prior to the start of their qualifying competition.

An event producer may not award more than <u>one</u> "Paid" and/or "Partial Paid" bid to the same team.

BID LIMITATIONS

The Cheerleading Worlds: A team may receive no more than one bid to The Cheerleading Worlds, "Paid," "Partial Paid," or "At Large," for any given division. Should a team already have been awarded a bid to The Worlds, decline acceptance of a "Paid"/"Partial Paid", or fail to accept the "Paid"/"Partial Paid" bid by the deadline noted, that bid may be transferred to an alternate team at the sponsoring event producer's discretion. The sponsoring event producer may not transfer ("hand down") any "At Large" bids or declined "At Large" bids. If a team has already accepted an "At Large" bid and opts to compete for another bid, they will be eligible only for a "Paid" or Partially Paid" bid. They will not be eligible for another "At Large" bid unless they decline the first "At Large" bid they were awarded, BEFORE competing for another "At Large" bid. Accepting or declining bids must be done in writing to the sponsoring event producer and the USASF.

BID RECEIVING REQUIREMENTS

A team that receives and accepts any type of Worlds bid, must compete at the Worlds in the same division they were in at the qualifying event where their bid was awarded.

The number of participants that "performed" on the competition floor at the qualifying event where the team received their bid may not be exceeded by the number of participants competing in that same division at the Cheerleading Worlds.

TIMING REQUIREMENTS FOR BID ACCEPTANCE

"Paid", "Partial Paid" and "At Large" bid winners must accept the bid, complete and return the Bid Winners Acceptance Form to the sponsoring event producer that awarded the bid. The form must be faxed within 72 hours after the last day of the event where the bid was received. This means each team will need to have made up their minds prior to the Worlds qualifying event about whether they are going to accept the bid should they receive one. And if so, who will be going and what the travel specifics will be. The purpose of this tight timing is to control last minute changes that increase costs and make the entire travel experience disorganized. "Paid" or "Partial Paid" bid not accepted and returned within 72 hours may be transferred to an alternate team at the sponsoring event producer's discretion. Any "At Large" bids not accepted and returned within 72 hours may be considered declined. The sponsoring event producer may not transfer (" hand down") any "At Large" or declined "At Large" bids.

Once a team accepts their bid, the team needs to

register by the listed deadline in The USASF/IASF Cheerleading and Dance Worlds Information and Registration Packet. Any team holding their registration in hopes of receiving a "Paid" or "Partial Paid" bid at a later Worlds bid qualifier and are unsuccessful, will still be late registration and will be placed on hold.

THE CHEERLEADING WORLDS TRAVEL PACKAGE AND REGISTRATION

All team registration packets and required documents must be received in the USASF/IASF office by the noted deadlines in The Cheerleading Worlds Information and Registration Packets. PLEASE READ the Registration Deadlines and Payment Policies page. These packets include all of the information, package pricing, forms, and deadlines necessary for the Worlds registration. Extra copies of Cheerleading Worlds Information and Registration Packets for spectators may be downloaded and printed from the USASF.net website.

International Teams - all visa requests will be cut off on February 15, 2009 and team registration packets and required documents must be received in the USASF/IASF office by the noted deadlines in The Cheerleading Worlds Information and Registration Packets. PLEASE READ the Registration Deadlines and Payment Policies page.

NEW: Copies of all participants' birth certificates, along with a picture of the participant attached to it, will **no longer** be required with the registration packets. However, copies of all participants' birth certificates or passports must be with the team's coach/representative at all times and readily available upon request from a Worlds official. Copies of your athlete's birth certificates on a USB/Zip drive is acceptable.

NEW: All "CHEER" participants are no longer required to be credentialed up to Level 5 (5 stars) in at least one category (tumbling, stunts, tosses). However, all "CHEER" participants (who will perform at Worlds) must be a member of the USASF in order to join the team in the warm-up room/area and compete at The Cheerleading Worlds. IMPORTANT: Each participant's name and USASF Membership ID# will be required on The Cheerleading Worlds' team roster form. For information about USASF Athlete Membership and or Credentialing, please contact your USASF Regional Director. USASF/IASF Regional Directors' contact information is located on the USASF.net website.

COACHES:

- Each competing gym or organization must be a member of the USASF/IASF and in good standing with the USASF/IASF.
- Must be a USASF or IASF Credentialed Coach, up to Level 5 (5 stars) in at least one category (tumbling, stunts, tosses), to enter the warm-up room/area at the Cheerleading Worlds.
- Must be listed as a coach of the performing team on all paperwork received by the USASF/IASF.
- Must be a coach in good standing at the gym they are representing.

Must understand that they are a representative
 of the USASF/IASF Event Producer that
 awarded them the bid ("Paid"/"Partial
 Paid"/"At Large") at the USASF/IASF Worlds
 Championship. They agree to act with complete respect, sportsmanship, and graciousness at all times while representing the
 USASF/IASF Event Producer they represent at
 the USASF/IASF Worlds Championships.

RULES

The Cheerleading Worlds follows USASF/IASF Level 5 and Level 6 Rules and General Safety Rules. They are listed on the USASF.net website.

SUBMITTING VIDEOTAPE FOR LEGALITY REVIEW

In an effort to ensure a penalty-free competition, all teams for The Cheerleading Worlds are encouraged to submit a videotape or DVD of the routine they will perform at the Worlds competition. This videotape or DVD should clearly show all stunts and tumbling so that they may be reviewed for legality purposes. Routines will be reviewed by an independent, neutral judging panel and the USASF Rules Committee. To secure confidentiality, the results of this review will be communicated only to the participating gym and will not be shared with any other gym or with The Cheerleading Worlds judging panel. Only videotapes or DVDs are acceptable for review. Electronically submitted routines will not be reviewed.

Videotapes must be a clean VHS tape with the routine at the beginning of the tape. The tape or DVD must be clearly labeled with the following information:

- Team Name/Division/Level
- Team Representative's Name
- Team Representative's E-Mail Address and Phone Contact

Videotapes or DVDs are due by April 15, 2009 and must be mailed to the following address:

You will be notified by April 20, 2009 as to the results of the video review.

Note: Although routines will be reviewed for potential penalties prior to the competition via video submission, this does not preclude a team from being assessed a penalty while at the Worlds competition. The USASF/IASF will have rules judges in the warm-up area and on the performance floor at The Worlds competition to ensure that all rules regarding the competition are followed.

Score Sheets

Score sheets for the 2009 Cheerleading Worlds will be posted online at usasf.net by November 15, 2008.

SUBSTITUTIONS

The rule that applies to substitutions is as follows:

 A Maximum of 10 substitutions will be allowed per team for The Cheerleading Worlds Championship.

A substitute must be a regular paid participant from another team at the same gym and must have competed "on the floor" with that team from that gym at the same event where the bid was awarded. A substitute may also be one of the three rostered alternates from the team that was awarded the Worlds bid. Teams competing at Worlds qualifying events may roster no more than three alternates, from the same team's gym, that can be used as one to three of the 10 total substitutes permitted. All substitutes must meet the same eligibility requirements as the original team that was awarded a bid (i.e. age, etc.). Should a substitute become necessary after submission of your team's registered roster and after travel plans have been approved and confirmed, any additional costs associated with the substitution must be paid by the gym.

Each team registering for The Cheerleading Worlds must complete a team roster with the names of the team members, along with their USASF Member numbers, that are performing on the competition floor at the Worlds. Each name will have to be identified as an original participant of the team that received the bid or as a legal substitution. All names on the team rosters will be verified by the event producers who awarded the bids.

If a team is found to have made an improper substitution, this team will:

- Be disqualified.
- Be responsible for repaying the total cost of any funds received through a "Paid" or "Partial Paid" bid.
- Not be eligible for any type of bid to The Cheerleading or Dance Worlds for the following year.

The USASF/IASF sponsored bids, "paid" or "partial paid," are for team members and two coaches. All sponsored team members must be on the floor during the team's performance at The Cheerleading Worlds. Alternates and/or additional athletes/coaches brought to substitute for unplanned occurrences are not covered under "Paid" or "Partial Paid" bids and will not be funded by the sponsoring event producer and must be eligible for substitution under the aforementioned substitution rules.

The USASF/IASF Rules Committee will be responsible for ensuring compliance with all rules, including the Substitution Rule. Any variance from the above substitution rule will be at the sole discretion of the USASF/IASF Rules Committee.

CROSSOVERS

At The Cheerleading Worlds, crossovers of participants between teams from the same gym are NOT permitted. In other words, a participant can only compete on one team from a gym/program. Crossovers of participants from other gyms will not be permitted.

Crossovers of participants between cheer and dance teams from the same or other gyms are not permitted.

In other words, a performer may represent only **one** gym in either cheer or dance.

If teams are found to have a crossover, those teams will:

- Be disqualified.
- Be responsible for repaying the total cost of any funds received through a "Paid" or "Partial Paid" bid.
- Not be eligible for any type of bid to The Cheerleading or Dance Worlds for the following year.

OVERALL EXPERIENCE

The Worlds competition is unique compared to any other competition that you have attended. Every team that attends is an invited event champion or runner-up. Most participants and coaches will stay at Disney's All Star Resort, where the atmosphere is similar to an Olympic Village. Teams are encouraged and expected to respect and support each other. This includes cheering for each other during the competition. The competition is highly exclusive. We expect over 350 of the world's best cheer and dance teams.

This competition is hosted by the USASF/IASF on behalf of the member event producers and gyms. Every effort is made to focus on the participants. Individual event producer/gym branding and promotion is not permitted. The Cheer Worlds competition will be held in the Milk House, located at Disney's Wide World of Sports[™] Complex and/or at *Disney's* Hollywood Studios™. The Dance Worlds will be held in the World Showplace at Disney's EPCOT Center. Event details and venues are subject to While the level of competition is chanae. extremely intense, the atmosphere is congenial and professional. The judging panel is a diverse group of well-respected and experienced cheerleading and dance adjudicators from all over the world.

REGISTRATION DEADLINES & PAYMENT POLICIES

- REGISTRATIONS RECEIVED AFTER YOUR DEADLINE WILL BE ACCEPTED BASED ON HOTEL AVAILABILITY. HOTELS MAY FILL UP PRIOR TO PUBLISHED DEADLINE DATES.
- FOR BIDS RECIEVED BEFORE MARCH 1, 2009:
 - All items are due with Registration by March 13.

No changes will be accepted after March 23, 2009.

NOTE: All registrations that have a March 13 deadline, will be held for processing until after the April 6 deadline. Hotel rooms may not be available. Any team holding their registration in hopes of receiving a "Paid" or "Partial Paid" bid at a later Worlds bid qualifier and are unsuccessful, will still be late registration and will be placed on hold.

FOR CANCELLATIONS RECEIVED ON OR BEFORE MARCH 23, 2009

All monies will be refunded with the exception of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) per person that will apply to cover hotel and entertainment guarantees. Cancellations received **after** March 23, 2009 will result in a **FULL FORFEITURE** of all monies paid. All cancellations must be in writing to the Cheerleading Worlds. We will not accept cancellations by phone.

FOR BIDS RECIEVED IN MARCH OR APRIL:

All of the items are due with Registration by April 6.

No changes will be accepted after April 13, 2009.

FOR CANCELLATIONS RECEIVED ON OR BEFORE APRIL 13, 2009

All monies will be refunded with the exception of two hundred dollars (\$200.00) per person that will apply to cover hotel and entertainment guarantees. Cancellations received **after** April 13, 2009 will result in a **FULL FORFEITURE** of all monies paid. All cancellations must be in writing to the Cheerleading Worlds. We will not accept cancellations by phone.

TEAM PAYMENT MUST BE IN THE FORM OF A CREDIT CARD, CASHIER'S CHECK OR MONEY ORDER!! NO GYM/BOOSTER CHECKS!

ALL REGISTRATION MATERIAL WILL BE RETURNED IF SUBMITTED WITH A GYM CHECK.

PARTICIPANT BIRTH CERTIFICATES

Teams will no longer be required to submit a picture and a copy of each participants birth certificate with their registration. However, a copy of each participants birth certificate or passport must be made readily available upon request of a Worlds Official. Copies of your athlete's birth certificates on a USB/Zip drive is acceptable.

HOTEL AND TRAVEL

1. What is the advantage of purchasing The Worlds Travel package?

NOTE: All athletes competing at The Cheerleading and Dance Worlds must purchase a travel package or commuter package.

The two main reasons teams and spectators purchase the travel package are convenience and savings.

a) Convenience-Everything is handled for you. Disney's Magical Express will pick you up and take you back to the Orlando International airport. There is no hassle of renting vans or cars and finding drivers. Hotel registration is smoother and rooms are guaranteed. The USASF/IASF office works together with Walt Disney World to block your rooms so your entire group stays together.

If you book your own trip, you have to:

Step 1: Call travel Agency or airlines (which could take hours).

Step 2: Send in deposit for airline tickets.

Step 3: Call several hotels to get room rates and availability.

Step 4: Guarantee all rooms using person credit card for deposit.

Step 5: Request reimbursement check from the gym.

Step 6: Send your rooming list to the hotel.

Step 7: Call car rental agencies to find out rates and regulations of drivers.

Step 8: Fill out registration form for The Worlds and mail in with registration fees.

If you book with USASF/IASF you have to:

Step 1: Call Cheer Travel Rewards or your local travel agent to book flights.
(cheertravelrewards.com or 1-800-941-1088)

Step 2: Send in deposits for airline tickets.

Step 3: Fill out registration forms for the USASF/IASF and mail in deposits.

b) Savings- Because of our partner ship with the Walt Disney World Resort, the USASF/IASF is able to negotiate discounted rates for hotel rooms and theme park tickets.

2. What hotel are we staying at?

Accommodations will be provided at Disney's All Star Resorts and Disney's Caribbean Beach Resort. Your team may choose which resort they would like to be housed. Disney's All Star Resort is a very nice yet economical hotel. Disney's Caribbean Beach Resort is a more upscale hotel on the Walt Disney World property. Therefore the main difference in package prices is the hotel cost only. All other services will remain the same for both hotels. In the event that the Walt Disney World Resorts sell out of rooms, USASF/IASF will make arrangements with an alternate hotel off property. PLEASE NOTE: Hotels may fill up prior to posted dead-

3. We have parents who would like to come to the Championship. Can they sign up for The Worlds travel package?

Of course! A lot of coaches meet with the parents and include them on the travel package with their team. However, we encourage family members and friends to register with us directly. For the *NEW* Family and Friends registration form, see pages in the back of The Worlds Registration Packet.

4. We have an uneven number of girls. Can we pay the quad rate for three girls in a room?

No. The travel package prices have been calculated according to how many people are in each room.

5. Can we have five people in a room?

Please tear out along the perforations. You may make copies of this form.

No. The All Star Resorts and Caribbean Beach Resort do not allow more than four people to a room.

6. We are arriving in Orlando at 10:00 a.m. on Friday, will our hotel rooms be ready?

Most hotels do not guarantee check in until 4:00 p.m. However, if there are rooms ready in your block, the hotel will check you in early. Please be sure to communicate this to your entire group that is traveling with you.

7. Our team doesn't leave Orlando until 6:00 p.m. on Tuesday. What can we do all day?

Hotel check out is at 11:00 a.m. If you would like, you can take a Walt Disney World shuttle bus to Downtown Disney-West Side to shop. The hotel will be glad to store your luggage for you, but you will be responsible for picking them up before you depart. However, the hotel's bellmen will not move carry-on bags, electronics, or trophies.

TICKETS AND COMPETITION

When will we receive our Walt Disney World® tickets for the Championship?

You receive your tickets when you register at The Worlds Check In Desk at your hotel in Orlando.

Do we use our 4-day PARK HOPPER ticket for competition?

Yes. You will need a Walt Disney World® ticket to enter Disney's Hollywood Studios™, EPCOT® as well as the Wide World of Sports® Complex for competition. Admission to Disney's Wide world of Sports® is NOT considered a theme park admission, and therefore does not use a day on your Park Hopper.

What does "PARK HOPPER" mean?

A PARK HOPPER allows you to go from Theme Park to Theme Park. Example: you can use your PARK HOPPER ticket to enter Disney's Hollywood Studios™ for Competition Saturday morning and then go to Epcot® that evening, and it is only considered one day of admission. However, these tickets are only valid for four days.

Will attending The Worlds Block Party take days off of my PARK HOPPER pass?

For The Worlds Block Party at Disney's Hollywood Studios™, a day will not be taken off of your PARK HOPPER pass. Please Note: YOU MUST HAVE A WRISTBAND TO ATTEND THE PARTY.

If we do not use all four days of our Walt Disney World® tickets, may we use them next year?

No. All of the discounted tickets sold at The Worlds an expiration date that is listed on the back of your ticket.

Do spectators have to purchase a Walt Disney World® PARK HOPPER ticket in order to watch competition at Disney's Wide World of Sports®? No! If you are only going to the Wide World of Sports Milkhouse, you may purchase a ticket at the door for \$25 per day per person. However, if you purchase a Walt Disney World® PARK HOPPER ticket from the USASF/IASF it includes admission into Wide World of Sports®.

7. Are there discounted park tickets available for family and friends not on the travel package?



- 1. I understand that cheerleading is a competitive activity, which requires the proper training techniques for all athletes under my direction.
- 2. I attest I have been properly trained in basic cheerleading techniques, proper skill progression, and safety precautions.
- 3. I understand it is my ethical duty to put the interest and safety of my athletes first, and not to put cheerleaders under my direction at risk unnecessarily.
- 4. I understand that only USASF/IASF CREDENTIALED COACHES are permitted in the practice area and backstage at The Cheerleading Worlds.
- 5. I understand that only USASF/IASF MEMBER ATHLETES may compete at the Worlds!

SPORTSMANSHIP

- 1. I will support The Cheerleading Worlds outcome and represent my program with integrity.
- 2. I understand my position as a role model for my team and will conduct myself in a professional manner.
- 3. I will display good sportsmanship and require such of my cheerleaders, parents/family of performers.

HOTEL

- 1. Absolutely NO tape or paint of any kind on any walls, windows or doors.

The Worldwide Governing Authority

I. GENERAL COMPETITION RULES

- A.The Cheerleading Worlds competition will follow the most recent version of the USASF General Rules and Age Level Rules Chart. Refer to the USASF.net website for details.
- B. All Routines must be "Music Only" and performance time may not exceed two minutes and thirty seconds. Timing will begin with the first movement, voice, or note of music, whichever comes first.
- C.If a team exceeds the time limit, a five point per judge penalty will be assessed for each violation. BECAUSE PENALTIES ARE SEVERE, IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT ALL TEAMS TIME THEIR PERFORMANCE SEVERAL TIMES PRIOR TO ATTENDING THE COMPETITION AND LEAVE A SEVERAL SECOND CUSHION TO ALLOW FOR VARIATIONS IN SOUND EQUIPMENT.
- D.All teams who advance to The Cheerleading Worlds Event may use as many songs in the musical portion of their routine as they like. Each song MUST BE LICENSED ONLY BY ASCAP or BMI. This is due to the television network requirements. All music (including entire songs or any portion of a song) must be licensed by either ASCAP or BMI (or both) to be used in your routine for The Cheerleading Worlds. Any violation of this rule may subject the team to disqualification from the tournament and any associated television programs.
- E. Participants must start in the competition area with at least one body part on the ground. Teams may line up anywhere inside the competition area. The competition area will be determined by the tournament director according to the size of the facility being used. Approximate floor size will be 54 feet wide x 42 feet deep (9 strips).
- F. All introductions (tumbling, entrances, chants, spell-outs, etc.) are considered part of the routine and are timed as part of the performance. There should not be any organized exits or other activities after the official ending of the routine.
- G.If a sign or prop is thrown outside the performing area, that team will receive a one point per judge deduction for each violation. Signs or props may be placed or dropped outside the performing area by a team member who must remain inside the performing area.
- H.Any team in violation of the Specific Safety Regulations will be assessed deduction for each violation.

II. THE DANCE WORLDS COMPETITION RULES AND GUIDELINES

Refer to The Dance Worlds Information and Registration Packet or the usasf.net website!

III. INTERRUPTION OF PERFORMANCE

A. UNFORESEEN CIRCUMSTANCES

- 1) If, in the opinion of the competition officials, a team's routine is interrupted because of failure of the competition equipment, facilities, or other factors attributable to the competition rather than the team, the team affected should STOP the routine.
- 2) The team will perform the routine again in its entirety, but will be evaluated ONLY from the point where the interruption occurred. The degree and effect of the interruption will be determined by the competition officials.

B. FAULT OF TEAM

Please tear out along the perforations. You may make copies of this form.

- 1) In the event a team's routine is interrupted because of failure of the team's own equipment, the team must either continue the routine or withdraw from the competition.
- 2) The competition officials will determine if the team will be allowed to perform at a later time. If decided by officials, the team will perform the routine again in its entirety, but will be evaluated ONLY from the point where the interruption occurred.

C. INJURY

- In the event that an injury causes the team's routine to be interrupted, the team must either continue the routine or withdraw from the competition.
- Competition officials reserve the right to stop the routine if an injury occurs.
- 3) The competition officials will determine if the team will be allowed to perform at a later time. If decided by officials, the team will perform the routine again in its entirety, but will be evaluated ONLY from the point where the interruption occurred.

IV. HOW TO HANDLE PROCEDURAL OUESTIONS

Any question concerning the rules or procedures of the tournament will be handled exclusively by one designated representative of the team (i.e. director, coach or captain) and will be directed only to a Tournament Official. Such questions should be made prior to the team's competition performance. Any questions concerning the team's performance should be made to a Tournament Official immediately after the team's performance.

V. INTERPRETATIONS AND RULINGS

Any interpretation of any aspect of these Rules and Regulations or any decision involving any other aspect of the tournament will be rendered by the Worlds Competition Rules Committee. The Worlds Competition Rules Committee will render a judgment in an effort to ensure that the tournament proceeds in a manner consistent with the general spirit and goals of the tournament. The Rules Committee will consist of the Tournament Director, Head Judge, and either the USASF Rules Committee Chairman or a tournament official designated by the Chairman. The Tournament Director may appoint additional members to those listed above to be members of the Worlds Competition Rules Committee.

VI. FINALITY OF DECISIONS

By participating in this championship, each team agrees that the decisions by the judges will be final and will not be subject for review. Each team acknowledges the necessity for the judges to make prompt and fair decisions in this competition and each team therefore expressly waives any legal, equitable, administrative or procedural review of such decisions.

VII. SPORTSMANSHIP

All participants agree to conduct themselves in a manner displaying good sportsmanship throughout and following the tournament. The coach and/or gym owner of each team is responsible for seeing that team members, coaches, parents and any other persons affiliated with the team conduct themselves accordingly. Severe cases of unsportsmanlike conduct are grounds for disqualification as explained in this document above.

VIII. DEDUCTIONS AND DISOUALIFICATIONS

Any team in violation of the "Rules and Regulations" will be assessed a deduction for each violation. Any team that does not adhere to the terms and procedures in the "Rules and Regulations" may be disqualified from the competition and automatically forfeit the right to any prizes or awards presented by the competition. In addition, the team may also forfeit the opportunity to participate in the Cheerleading or Dance Worlds the following year.

IX. SCORES AND RANKINGS

Individual judges score sheets are for the exclusive use of each particular judge. Each judge has the responsibility and authority to review and submit his or her final scores and rankings prior to the final tally of the

scores for all teams. Scores and rankings will be available only to coaches or gym owners at the conclusion of the competition. Ties will not be broken.

X. TELEVISION COVERAGE

The Cheerleading Worlds maybe nationally televised. Because of the format of the show, not all finalist teams will be shown on the telecast.

XI. APPEARANCES, ENDORSEMENTS AND PUBLICITY

All teams winning titles, awards or prizes agree to have all appearances, endorsements and publicity approved through the USASF office.

B. Tumbling over, under, or through a stunt, individual, or prop, is not allowed.

C. Tumbling while holding or in contact with any prop is not allowed.

D. Assisted, or connected tumbling is not allowed. Clarification: Double cartwheels and double forward rolls are allowed because they will be interpreted as stunts, not assisted tumbling.

E. Dive rolls:

- 1. Dive rolls performed in a swan/arched position are not allowed.
- 2. Dive rolls that involve twisting are not allowed.

A. Skills are allowed up to 1 flipping and 2 twisting rotations.

XII. 2008-2009 USASF SAFETY GUIDELINES GENERAL SAFETY RULES AND ROUTINE REQUIREMENTS

- 1. All athletes must be supervised during all official functions by a qualified director/coach.
- Coaches must require proficiency before skill progression. Coaches must consider the individual, group, and team skill levels with regard to proper performance level placement.
- 3. All teams, gyms, coaches and directors should have an emergency response plan in the event of an injury.
- 4. Athletes and coaches may not be under the influence of alcohol, narcotics, performance enhancing substances, or over-the-counter medications while participating in a practice or performance that would hinder the ability to supervise or execute a routine safely.
- 5. Athletes **must** always practice and perform on an appropriate surface.
- Soft-soled shoes must be worn while competing. No dance shoes/boots, and/or gymnastics slippers (or similar) allowed. Shoes must have a solid sole.
- 7. Jewelry of any kind including but not limited to ear, nose, tongue, belly button and facial rings, clear plastic jewelry, bracelets, necklaces and pins on uniforms are prohibited. Jewelry must be removed and may not be taped over. (Exception: medical ID tags/bracelets, and uniform rhinestones. Rhinestones are illegal when adhered to the skin as opposed to a uniform. Temporary tattoos are also allowed.)
- 8. Any height increasing apparatus used to propel a competitor is prohibited. (Exception: spring floor)
- P. Flags, banners, signs, pom pons, megaphones, and pieces of cloth are the only props allowed. Props with poles or similar support apparatus may not be used in conjunction with any kind of stunt or tumbling. All props must be safely discarded out of harms way (e.g. throwing a hard sign across the mat from a stunt would be illegal).

Level 5 Stunts

- A. A spotter is required for all extended stunts.
- B. Single leg extended stunts are allowed.

Level 5 Standing/Running Tumbling

- C. Twisting mounts and twisting transitions are allowed up to 2 twisting rotations by the top person.
- D. Free flipping stunts or transitional are not allowed.
- Prep level or above pendulum and pendulum style transitional stunts where the top person falls away from the bases requires three stationary catchers, at least two of which are not original bases. Physical contact must be maintained with all of the original base(s).
- F. Single based split catches are not allowed.
- G. Single based double awesomes/cupies require a separate spotter for each top person.
- H. Level 5 Stunts Release Moves
 - Release moves are allowed but must not exceed more than eighteen inches above extended arm level. (Example: Tic-tocks are allowed.)
 - 2. Release moves may not land in a prone position.
 - 3. Release moves must return to original bases.
 - 4. Helicopters are allowed up to a 180 degree rotation with a 1/2 twist and must be caught by at least 3 catchers, one of which is positioned at head and shoulder area of the top person.
 - 5. Release moves may not intentionally travel.

I. Level 5 Stunts - Inversions

- Extended inverted stunts allowed. Also, see "Stunts" and "Pyramids."
- Downward inversions are allowed from prep level and above and must be assisted by at least three bases, at least two of which are

positioned to protect the head and shoulder area. Contact must be B. initiated at the shoulder level (or above) of the bases. (Exception: A controlled powerpressing of an extended inverted stunt (i.e. needle) to shoulder level is allowed). Clarification: Catchers must C. make contact with the head and shoulder area.

- Downward inversions must maintain contact with an original D. base.
- 4. Downward inversions from above prep level may not be caught and/or land in an inverted position. Clarification: Top person may not be caught or land with their shoulders below their hips.

Level 5 Pyramids

- A. Pyramids must follow Level 5 "Stunts" and "Dismounts" rules and are allowed up to 2 high.
- Top persons must receive primary support from a base.

Level 5 Pyramids - Release Moves

- 1. During a pyramid transition, a top person may pass above 2 persons high while in direct physical contact with at least one person at prep level or below.
- Primary weight may not be borne at second level. Clarification: The transition must be continuous.
- 3. Non-inverted pyramid release moves must be caught by at least 2 catchers.
 - a. In pyramids where the top person travels over their bracer (i.e. leap frogs or wolf wall transitions), both catchers must be stationary.
 - b. Both catchers must maintain visual contact with the top person throughout the entire transition.
- 4. Non inverted transitional pyramids may involve changing bases. When changing bases:
 - a. The top person must maintain physical contact with a person at prep level or below.
 - The top person must be caught by at least 2 catchers. Both catchers must be stationary and may not be involved with any other skill or choreography when the transition is initiated.

D. Level 5 Pyramids - Inversions

Must follow Level 5 Stunt Inversions rules.

Level 5 Pyramids - Release Moves w/ Braced Inversions

- 1. Pyramid transitions may involve braced inversions (including braced flips) while released from the bases if contact is maintained with at least 1 persons at prep level or below. Contact must be maintained throughout entire transition with either the top person(s) or the base(s).
- Braced inversions (including braced flips) are allowed up to 1-1/4 flipping rotations.
- 3. Braced inversions (including braced flips) are allowed up to 1 twist if contact is maintained with 2 top persons at prep level A. A spotter is required:
- 4. Inverted transitional pyramids may involve changing bases.
- 5. Braced inversions (including braced flips) must be in continuous
- 6. All braced inversions (including braced flips) must be caught by at least 3 catchers.
 - a. All catchers must be stationary.
 - All catchers must maintain visual contact with the top person throughout the entire transition.
 - The 3 catchers may not be involved with any other skill or choreography when the transition is initiated.
- 7. Braced inversions (including braced flips) may not travel downward while inverted.

Level 5 Dismounts

A. Cradles from single based stunts at prep level and above must have a **separate** spotter with at least one hand/arm supporting the head and shoulder area through the cradle.

- Cradles from multi-based stunts at prep level and above must have two catchers and a separate spotter with at least one hand/arm supporting the head and shoulder area through the cradle.
- Dismounts to the performing surface must be assisted by an original
- Up to a 2-1/4 twisting rotations allowed from all stunts.
- No free flipping dismounts allowed.
- Tension drops/rolls of any kind are not allowed.
- When cradling single based double awesomes/cupies 2 catchers must catch each top person.

Level 5 Tosses

- Tosses are allowed up to a total of 4 tossing bases. One base must be behind the top person during the toss and may assist the top per-
- Tosses must be performed from ground level and must land in a cradle position. Top person must be caught in a cradle position by at least 3 original bases one of which is positioned at the head and shoulder area of the top person. Bases must remain stationary during the toss (i.e. No intentional traveling tosses). (Exception: A 1/2 turn is allowed by bases as in a kick full basket.)
- Flipping, inverted or traveling tosses are not allowed.
- No stunt, pyramid, individual, or prop may move over or under a toss, and a toss may not be thrown over, under, or through stunts, pyramids, individuals, or props.
- Up to 2-1/2 twisting rotations allowed.

XIV. USASF SPECIFIC LEVEL 6 RULES

Level 6 General Tumbling

- All tumbling must originate from and land on the performing surface. (Exception: Tumbler may [without hip-over-head rotation] rebound from his/her feet into a stunt transition. Rebounding to a prone position in a stunt is allowed.)
- Tumbling over, under, or through a stunt, individual, or prop, is not allowed.
- Tumbling while holding or in contact with any prop is not allowed.
- Assisted, or connected tumbling is not allowed.
- Dive rolls:
 - 1. Dive rolls performed in a swan/arched position are not allowed.
 - 2. Dive rolls that involve twisting are not allowed.

Level 6 Standing/Running Tumbling

Skills are allowed up to 1 flipping and 2 twisting rotations.

Level 6 Stunts

- - 1. During extended one-arm stunts other than an extension, awesomes/cupies or liberties
 - 2. When the load/transition involves a twist or flip
- Twisting stunts and transitions are allowed up to 2 twisting rotations by the top person.
- Free flipping or assisted flipping stunts and transitions are allowed. Rewinds must originate from ground level only and are allowed up to 1 flipping and 2 twisting rotations. Exception: Rewinds to a cradle position are allowed. All free flipping transitions caught at shoulder level or below must use an additional catcher who protects the head and neck. (example: a flip that lands in a straddle position requires a hands-on spotter)
- Transitional stunts may involve changing bases.
- Single based split catches are not allowed.
- Single based double awesomes/cupies require a separate spotter for each top person

Level 6 Pyramids

For 2-½ high pyramids, there must be a spotter in front and back for each person on the top level, and the spotter(s) must be in position the entire time the top person(s) is at the 2-½ high level(s) Spotters may stand slightly to the side but must remain in a position to adequately spot the top person. Spotters must maintain visual contact with the top person the entire time the top person is at the 2-½ high level. Spotters may not be a primary support of the pyramid.
- C. Free-flyings mounts must originate from ground level only and are allowed up to 1 flipping and 1 twisting rotation, or 0 flipping and 2 twisting rotations.
- D. Level 6 Pyramids Release Moves
 - During a pyramid transition, a top person may pass above 2-1/2 high while in direct physical contact with at least one person at prep level or below.
- E. Level 6 Pyramids Inversions
 - 1. Inverted stunts are allowed up to 2-1/2 persons high and must be braced by at least 1 person at prep level or below.

 2. Downward inversions from above prep level must be assisted by at least 2 bases. Top person must maintain contact with a base or another top person.
- F. Level 6 Pyramids Release Moves w/ Braced Inversions
 - 1. Braced flips are allowed up to up to 1-1/4 flipping and 1 twisting rotation.
 - 2. Braced flips are allowed if direct physical contact is maintained with at least 1 top person at prep level or below and must be caught by at least 2 catchers.

Level 6 Dismounts

A. Single based cradles that exceed 1-1/4 twisting rotations must have a spotter assisting the cradle with at least one hand/arm supporting the head and shoulder of the top per-

- son
- B. Dismounts to the performing surface from stunts and pyramids must be assisted.
- C. Up to a 2-1/4 twist cradle is allowed from all stunts and pyramids up to 2 persons high **and requires at least 2 catchers.**Cradles from 2-1/2 high pyramids are allowed up to 1-1/4 twist and require 3 catchers. (Exception: 2-1-1 thigh stands may perform 2 twists from a forward facing stunt only. E.g. extension, liberty, heel stretch).
- D. Free flipping dismounts are allowed up to 1 flipping and 0 twisting rotations.
- E. Free flipping dismounts to the performance surface are not allowed.
- F. Flips into cradles from prep level **or below stunts** require at least 2 catchers, one of which is an original base.
- G. Flips that originate above prep level are not allowed. (Exception: 3/4 front flip may occur from a 2-1/2 high pyramid but requires 2 catchers and an additional spotter positioned at the head and shoulder area of the top person. Spotter may stand slightly to the side but must use at least one hand/arm to catch under the top person's head and shoulders.)
- H. Tension drops/rolls of any kind are not allowed.
- When cradling single based double awesomes/cupies 2 catchers must catch each top person. Catchers and bases must be stationary prior to the initiation of the dismount.

Level 6 Tosses

- A. Tosses are allowed up to a total of 4 tossing bases. One base must be behind the top person during the toss and may assist the top person into the toss.
- B. Tosses must be performed from ground level and must land in a cradle position by at least 3 bases, one of which is positioned at the head and shoulders area of the top person.

- Flipping tosses are allowed up to 1 flipping rotation and 2 twists.
- D. No stunt, pyramid, individual, or, prop may move over or under a toss, and a toss may not be thrown over, under, or through stunts, pyramids, individuals, or props.
- E. Non-flipping tosses may not exceed 3-1/2 twists.
- F. Top persons tossed to another set of bases must be caught in a cradle position by at least 3 stationary catchers. Catchers may not be involved in any other choreography and must have visual contact with top person when the toss is initiated and must maintain visual contact throughout the entire toss. The toss is allowed up to 0 flipping and 1-1/2 twisting rotations. (Exception: 3/4 front flips with no twists are allowed)
